Gonzales man, 16-year-old runaway, arrested on drug charges

Ascension Parish Sheriff Jeff Wiley reports the arrest of 40-year-old Fabian Mills, of Gonzales, on drugs and illegal possession of stolen firearms charges early Thursday morning, July 16.

Deputies began investigating an assault complaint on Mills after a victim told deputies that he came to her residence and demanded to find her son who allegedly stole \$5,000 worth of Heroin and a firearm from Mills. The victim stated that Mills pointed a handgun at her and threatened to shoot her.

As the investigation continued, Mills was located and arrested at his residence. A 16-year-old runaway from Livingston Parish was also located in the residence and arrested.

Deputies searched the residence and located a quantity of methamphetamine, a quantity of heroin, multiple drug paraphernalia, two firearms, and a shot gun and revolver that were reported stolen, said Sheriff Wiley.

Deputies also located several clothing items with tags still on them that may have been stolen from a local store.

Fabian Mills, 40, of 714 S. Sammy Street, Gonzales, was arrested and charged with aggravated assault with a firearm, possession of heroin, possession of schedule II CDS, possession of marijuana, drug paraphernalia; prohibited acts, two counts illegal possession of stolen firearms, illegal carrying of weapons, contributing to the delinquency of juveniles. He was booked into the Ascension Parish Jail where his bond was set at \$126,089 by Judge Kliebert.

The 16-year-old juvenile was arrested and placed in the Assumption Detention Center and charged with possession of methamphetamine, possession of heroin, possession of marijuana, possession of drug paraphernalia, and resisting arrest.
