Donaldsonville man arrested after two-month drug investigation

During a two-month-long investigation into drug activity, the Ascension Parish Sheriff's Narcotics Detectives, along with Louisiana State Police, arrested a Donaldsonville man Thursday evening, January 14, according to Major Kevin Hanna.

Narcotics detectives received information that James Miles, 38, was possibly selling drugs out of a residence, 502 Front Street in Donaldsonville. On Thursday afternoon, detectives executed a search warrant on the residence and located a quantity of marijuana, methamphetamine, cocaine, hydrocodone, ecstasy, a digital scale, and over \$800 in cash.

The drugs seized are estimated at \$1,000 in street value, added Major Hanna.

Miles, 38, of 502 Front Street in Donaldsonville, was arrested and charged with possession with intent to distribute a schedule I CDS, possession with intent to distribute marijuana, three counts possession with intent to distribute schedule II CDS, and drug paraphernalia.

Miles has a lengthy criminal history with 21 arrests with charges stemming from simple battery, money laundering, and multiple drug charges.

He was booked into the Ascension Parish Jail where no bond has been set yet.
